Lower Merion Superintendent Khalid Mumin Selected as New Secretary of Education

Governor Josh Shapiro has named Khalid Mumin, superintendent of the Lower Merion School District, as Pennsylvania's newest education secretary.

Mumin, a Philadelphia native, has led the Montgomery County district for a little over a year. He came to Lower Merion from Reading, where he was named Pennsylvania's Superintendent of the Year in 2021.

Mumin also said in a statement, "I look forward to working to fully fund our schools, make our students' mental health a priority, and empower parents and guardians to ensure their children receive a quality education."

Finding the North Star of New Chapter 49 Competencies

The north star has been guiding navigators and others seeking direction for centuries. With new competencies and requirements, educator preparation programs are looking for a way forward, as well. The Spring Conference will provide clarity on the three new competency areas as a "no travel" opportunity for attendees to engage in meaningful discussion.

Keynote speaker is Dr. Troy Hutchings. Troy Hutchings researches, writes, and speaks in the areas of professional ethics, educator misconduct, and frameworks for an ethical and legal teaching practice. Hutchings also provides expert witness testimony in judicial hearings; collaborates on policy initiatives with state, federal and provincial agencies; and has been the subject matter expert on a variety of national projects dealing with educator ethics including the Model Code of Ethics for Educators and the National Council for the Advancement of Educator Ethics.

Our Keynote Presentation includes a Panel of Experts to provide additional information on the new competency areas: Shane Crosby, Exec Dir/Legal Counsel, PDE Office of Gen Council; Dr. Juliet Curci, Assistant Dean of College Access/Persistence, Temple University; and Dr. Diane Santori, Chair of the West Chester University Department of Literacy.

Following the opening session are breakout sessions on each of the competency areas:

- 1. Professional Ethics
- 2. Culturally Responsive and Sustaining Pedagogy
- 3. Structured Literacy

The breakout sessions will repeat one time, and the day will end with remarks from PDE.

As always, the end of the day includes an opportunity to win prizes including gift cards and/or free registration to upcoming conferences.
