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Spring Conference Update

Please attend our "no travel required" Spring Conference, on March 20:

Making Creative, Clever, and Courageous Connections to Deepen the Pool

The shortage of qualified teachers and principals in Pennsylvania has been well-publicized. Less publicity has been given to solutions. While many contend that simpler qualifications will make the difference, PAC-TE members know that our teacher and principal preparation programs reflect the high quality of our respective college/university missions, as well as the Ch. 354 and Ch. 49 regulations that exert controls. Come to this conference to discover examples of partnerships that can help us deepen the pool of qualified and courageous educators and keep them afloat as they hone their skills.

Keynote speaker is Dr. Rebecca West Burns, a nationally recognized leader in teacher education. She has served in leadership positions for the National Association for Professional Development Schools, the AERA Professional Development Schools Research Special Interest Group and Supervision and Instructional Leadership Special Interest Group, and the Council of Professors of Instructional Supervision. She also has received national recognition for her exemplary school-university collaboration and impact on urban education. Burns has authored and co-authored more than 60 publications, including four books, and has given more than 130 presentations in local, state, regional, national and international contexts, including at our very own TEA a few years ago.

Following the Keynote are three breakout sessions:

1. School Counselors & School Social Workers as partners

- Supporting the Recruitment and Retention of New Teachers: Developing Teacher Leadership Through Instructional Coaching
- 3. Fireside Chat with Dr. Burns--extend the conversation and ask questions

Each Breakout Session is repeated, so attendees can easily choose two of the three sessions.

New option: We will offer a 1-hour optional session at the end of the conference for those who are interested in our online Book Club. The selected book is Elena Aguilera's *Onward: Cultivating Emotional Resilience in Educators*

The day will include a session with leaders from PDE.

The day will run from 9:00 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. and will be streamed via <u>Whova</u>, which offers a desktop or laptop experience and a mobile app experience. Conference events will be livestreamed through the app, and attendees can gather on their campuses or elsewhere or participate from home. No need to pay for lodging or travel.
