Conference Registration is Going On NOW

Please visit our Fall Conference <u>page</u> to register for the PAC– TE's Teacher Education Assembly (TEA)––otherwise known as our fall conference. NEW information is on that page, including the draft program schedule (subject to change). The dates are October 25–27, and the conference site is the same as last year––The Best Western Premier The Central Hotel and Conference Center in Harrisburg, which has totally renovated all of its guest rooms!

Pricing for all 3 days (includes Wednesday banquet and Thursday buffet lunch):

- Members: Only \$175 if you act before October 1. Then, \$225 until October 24. Pay at the door is available, too, for \$275, and may not include a meal.
- Non-members: \$275 until October 24. Pay at the door \$300, and may not include a meal.
- Hint: If you renew your membership before you register, get the \$100 discount (before October 1, that is.)
- No single day fees
- Registrations received after the meal counts are submitted may not include a meal. Be sure to register ahead of time.

Program:

The Program Committee has planned an impressive package of worthwhile <u>sessions</u> for your benefit. The conference theme is *THIS is Us: Educators rooted in inquiry, action, and progress* —which celebrates the ways in which educators have journeyed through this time period of transformation; regardless of the size, scope, or perceived level of impact.

Highlights:

- Opportunities to meet with peers to consider and create in a special face to face place (with special refreshments)!
- KEYNOTE: We are still finalizing this choice.
- PDE will be with us for two general sessions. Be sure to come meet Deputy Secretary of Education Dr. Kate Shaw on Thursday as she and Dr. Carissa Pokorny-Golden share their vision and outlook for the coming year. Dr. Katina Moten, the brand new Chief for the

Division of Professional Education and Teacher Quality joins us on Wednesday, along with members of her staff, to provide updates..

- 40+ sessions presented by your peers! This year we will have a larger number of interactive sessions, plus a number of work-in-progress sessions in which faculty share ongoing projects and seek feedback from the audience. Come find out what they're up to!
- PAC-TE Annual Meeting. Attend to learn the actions of your PAC-TE Board of Directors and cast a vote on PAC-TE business items.
- Meet the candidates running for PAC-TE Board of Directors open positions. New this year--the election opens during the conference so you can vote before you leave.
- Food. Wednesday attendees are invited to our dinner banquet and awards presentations. And who can resist our traditional Dessert Buffet on Wednesday night! Thursday attendees enjoy a buffet luncheon after the PAC-TE Annual Meeting. Snack breaks and coffee are available throughout each day. Overnight hotel guests also receive complimentary breakfast each morning. Note: Day of conference walk-in registrants cannot expect meals. Meal counts are given to the hotel a few days in advance, so be sure to register ahead of time.

HOTEL ROOMS: A block of rooms (at a reduced rate) is being held for PAC-TE conference attendees. You must contact the hotel directly at (717) 561–2800 before September 27. After that date, any unreserved rooms will be released and the cost to reserve them after that date will revert to their customary price.

NOTE: Membership dues <u>do not</u> automatically register you for this conference. Conference registration is separate from membership and must be purchased. However, members do get a discount on the conference price.

PAC-TE is seeking applicants to serve on a newly established Graduate Student Leadership Team (GSLT) for a maximum of a 2-year period that they are enrolled as a graduate student.

This is a wonderful opportunity for graduate students enrolled in an Institution of Higher Education (IHE) to become involved in a position of leadership at the state level with fellow graduate students and professionals from across Pennsylvania who are engaged in educator preparation. Graduate Student Leadership Team members would have a range of opportunities to collaborate with current PAC-TE members and teacher education stakeholders across the state, attend and assist with annual fall and spring conferences, as well as develop their own professional network through connections made within PAC-TE.

Additional benefits of acceptance:

 - Co-facilitating a collaborative session with a PAC-TE committee or board member
 - Assisting with technology/conference website/app
 - Submit a 1-page Reflection at the conclusion
 - Additional opportunity to get involved with the planning committee throughout the year
- Participation in networking or collaborative opportunities presented to the GSLT throughout the year

Possible Renewal on GSLT for a 2nd year: Graduate Student Leadership Team members will have the option of continuing their membership for a second year, after a review by the Ad Hoc Graduate Student Leadership Committee on their level of engagement during the first year receiving the award.
